Restore Leadership Academy's coed track team were the district champions and the girls' soccer team were the regional champions, even though they had two less players than their opponent! Not only are they incredible athletes, but these students teach us and their peers so much about the power of confidence and teamwork. It is amazing to see how these leaders work together and cheer each other on both in and out of the classroom!

On the Primary School campus, we have been focusing a lot on literacy, and we got some amazing test results back! We tested them on a range of skills such as their ability to say sounds, read familiar decodable words, and read a passage and answer questions. We saw improvement in every area, and we know they will keep striving for more! We wish you all could see their faces light up as they understand their first sentences or read aloud to their friends!

We also celebrated the opening of a new adult literacy center where traditional healers can come to learn how to read and write. Enrollment at all five of our literacy sites has increased, and we love watching these community leaders learn and lead with love!

Lastly, our prison school has more students than ever before, and nine students will be ready to graduate this year! We are cheering on all of our students at the prison school, primary and secondary school as they enter their final terms of the year and start prepping for end of year exams!

Over the summer, our school ran a special program for all of the kids in the Love Does Village. The kids loved it, and it was so wonderful to see the dedication and love that our teachers have for these students.

We are so grateful to work alongside local partners and local government to carry out these projects and manage the ongoing operations. In the next quarter, we plan to hand the school and hospital over to our local partners to continue to serve this community. We feel confident in their ability to operate these projects well, and know how much they care for these families!

The Love Does Baby Home is doing very well, and the babies are growing so fast! We opened this home last year when we learned that due to the environment of conflict and lack of resources, many young women who become pregnant are often unable to care for their babies. Tragically, they are sometimes forced to abandon them in the streets or at local hospitals for fear of their own lives. Thanks to your support, we opened a home for these babies and we now have an amazing team of nurses and caretakers that look after them each day, giving them all of the love and attention that they need and deserve. We are also buying a baby incubator for the home, and one of our nurses is trained in working with incubators and infants who need this kind of care. Having the incubator in the home will not only provide better care, but will also cut down on hospital expenses, and give even the littlest ones a place to grow and get healthy.

Thanks to your support, we continue to operate the Love Does Safe House in Mogadishu. The home is a refuge for women who have been victims of gender based violence to come for safety, medical attention and counseling. In addition, we partner with local organization to provide them with job training skills, and sports centered therapy. We have been building a basketball court as another way for the women to get exercise and have fun in a healthy way. The court is almost finished, and we are so excited for them to have this place to work together and have fun outdoors!
