#### UGANDA

Though the students and staff at <u>Restore Leadership Academy</u> were not able to come back on campus this quarter, our teachers and staff were hard at work creating and distributing packets of notes and worksheets to each of our students. In total, our teachers distributed 2,155 packets to our students in their hometowns all across the country. It took a tremendous amount of planning, dedication and effort, and we are so proud to see them all working together to support our students in these challenging times.

In addition to distributing notes to all of our enrolled students, our teachers and staff reached out to the community and supplied 650 additional packets of notes to students whose schools have not given them any curriculum since the lockdown.

Since the nationwide lockdown in March, our team has been working with the local district officials to identify and supply food aid to the most vulnerable families in the community. This quarter, we supplied a month's worth of food to the following groups: all 98 teachers and staff of Restore Leadership Academy, all 187 of the traditional healers enrolled in our adult literacy program, 300 local teachers who have not been paid since the start of the lockdown.

### SOMALIA

We are so grateful for your support of <u>our baby home and safe house</u> in Mogadishu. These facilities are the only ones of their kind in the area, and they both act not only as a life saving place to recover and receive care, but also as a resource for the community to turn to when they need it most. We currently have 16 babies living in our home and 7 women and girls in our safe house.

This quarter, our baby home also offered services to 18 additional babies who needed care, and our safe house provided care and services to an additional 19 women and girls. Our safe house moved to a larger property in September to accommodate for more women and girls should it be necessary.









#### **AFGHANISTAN**

We were so excited to be able to welcome our students back to school and into our <u>brand new school</u> building in August! Following regulations by the ministry of health and education, we were able to open our doors and resume in person classes with all 60 of our primary school students. We wish you could have seen all of their smiling faces when they got to see their friends again and explore the new building!

Our team is working hard to maintain fun and learning, while also keeping our students safe and supporting them and their families. We are so grateful to see this school be a foundation of love and support for this deserving community, especially in these times, and we cannot wait to watch it continue to grow!

Nepal has been greatly affected by the virus and continued stages of lockdowns as cases have increased. We have been working closely with our team to provide food aid and support to local families as well as all of our staff. Together with our wonderful friend Lauren Daigle and her foundation, the <u>Price Fund</u>, and in partnership with <u>Justice Rising</u>, we built a brand new school for 300 students! <u>The school is in Goma</u>, a city on the far east side of the Democratic Republic of Congo near the border of Rwanda. Goma is a conflict zone, the region has been unstable since the Kivu conflict, an armed conflict between the military and an armed rebel group, began in 2004.

The present circumstances have been really challenging for this already vulnerable community, and we are so grateful for the hope and excitement that this new school has brought to this community. Especially in these difficult times, we see how important it is to protect children and how much value education has in transforming entire communities. The new school will start at the beginning of October, and we are so excited and honored to work with this incredible community and see our school and these kids grow and learn!
