UGANDA

We have students back on campus! Our candidate classes at [Restore Leadership Academy and Primary school](#) (the students who will take exams this year) were able to come back on January 18. At the start of March, the students who will take their national exams next year were able to come back to campus. In total, we have 383 students back on campus, and they all have been so excited to be back and are all working so hard studying and are happy to be catching up with friends.

We had a wonderful all staff retreat in March! They had a day full of team building, good food and using the recreation facilities at a nearby venue. The main objectives of the retreat were determined by the end of 2020 staff evaluations, and were centered around communication, teamwork and respect. The staff were challenged through fun and engaging games that required them to work in small teams. It was a loud and fun Saturday, and they all walked away encouraged and excited to work together for the upcoming school year.

Our Launch students were able to go back to full time and on campus classes! Launch is our university scholarship program for graduates of our secondary school. We have 16 students in our program currently and fund all of their tuition costs. It's been great to see them all back on the campuses that they missed so much!

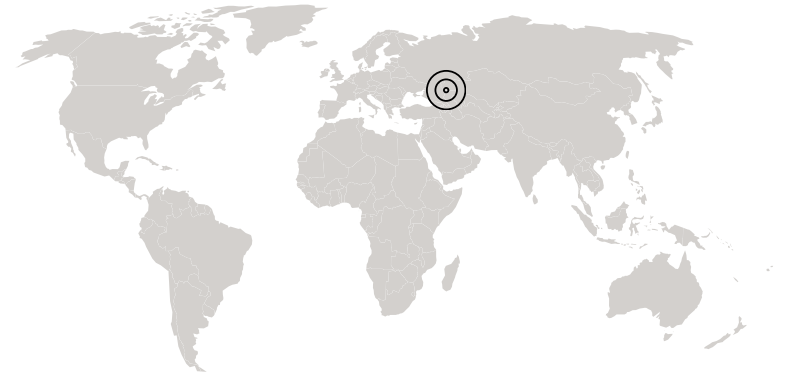


CONGO

We shipped two full containers of food to Congo to help with the current need there. 570,240 meals were delivered in total and we're grateful for the opportunity to help in this way. ARMENIA

We have a few special projects happening in Armenia! We're partnering with Aurora Humanitarian Initiative to help reconstruct and restore communities in Armenia after the recent conflict. The conflict in September 2020 resulted in many civilian casualties, the displacement of hundreds of thousands of people, and the destruction of whole cities by aerial bombardment.

Our first project is to repair a secondary school that was hit with an aerial bombardment. This school is located in Martuni, and has 400 students ages 5-14 attending. We are funding the restoration of the school, and are excited to give these students the safe and functional environment they deserve.

Our second project is a bakery! The Love Does Bakery will open in May in the Artsakh Askeran region of Armenia. It will provide bread to the whole community, who have all been displaced by the recent war. It will be run by a family who lives there, and will also provide 5 additional jobs to the local community. We are so grateful for our partnership with Aurora Humanitarian Initiative for helping us get involved in these wonderful communities.
